

Visit to Sydney - Dott. Piero Bassetti

On 24 May this year, your Chamber had the pleasure and opportunity to host a luncheon at the American Club in Sydney in honour of the visit of Dott. Piero Bassetti,the Chairman of Italbiz. Italbiz has now become one of our major corporate sponsors. Dott. Piero Bassetti is no stranger to our City of Sydney. He has been to Sydney on several occasions when he was President of Assocamerestero for the last 7 years. This is the Association based in Rome, which governs the 65 Italian Chambers of Commerce and Industry throughout the world. By way of background, Dott. Bassetti is a graduate of Bocconi University of Milan, Cornell University in the United States and also a graduate of the London School of Economics. Significantly, he was the first President of the Regional Government of Lombardy between 1970 and 1974. He was described in an article in the Washington Post as a "charismatic crusader" in the early years of Italian Regionalism. Dott. Bassetti went on to become a member of the Italian Parliament between 1976 and 1982, and has served as Chairman of a number of Italian Banks as well as being the President of the Milan Chamber of Commerce.

The Sydney Chamber of Commerce and Italbiz have entered into what may best be described as a joint co-operation and collaboration agreement with the main object being to promote the Italbiz Website and related services to Italian/Australian small and medium sized business enterprises in Australia. The prime objective of the Agreement of joint collaboration is to combine the specialised local knowledge of the Sydney Chamber of Commerce with the internet "know how" of Italbiz, and in that way exploit the power of the internet so as to provide small and medium sized Australian/Italian businesses with the state-of-the-art e-commerce tools and resources. This will in turn assist small and medium sized businesses to obtain a greater market share for their products, goods and services.

National Council

The National Council met in Adelaide over 21/22 June 2001. At this meeting I was confirmed as President of the National Council and Area Representative for Australia. The meeting was significant in that, after several months of constructive debate between all five State Chambers of Commerce, those efforts were finally codified in a document known as the "Heads of Agreement" which was duly signed by each of the five State Presidents. The essence of the document is that notwithstanding that each Chamber is governed by its own rules and regulations as set out in its own Constitution, and further obliged to follow the State Laws in which it is registered, there is no longer any barrier to the individual Chambers coming together as a National Council, harnessing their energies and co-ordinating their resources so as to produce a mutual and reciprocal benefit, not only to the individual Chambers, but also to the National Council.

Essentially, the National Council will be concerned with:

- Co-ordinating all the activities of all major projects;
- Being a vital entity desiring to incorporate new trade practices;
- Issuing guidelines for all the Chambers in Australia so that they can work together
 in harmony and produce state of the art service oriented offices.

Prime Minister's Luncheon

On Friday 6 July 2001 at the ANA Harbour Grand Hotel Sydney, your Chamber of Commerce held a Business Luncheon at which the guest speaker was the Prime Minister of Australia, the Honourable John Howard. The event proved to be an outstanding success.
